

Transfer Report

2014-15 Students Transfer to 4-yr Institutions as of May 2016

Summary

According to data received from the National Student Clearinghouse, 3,559 Delgado students that were enrolled in Academic Year 2014-15, transferred to another institution by Spring 2016.

Most transfer students transferred to UNO (20%), followed by LSU (14%), and then Southeastern (13%).

Of the transfers previous programs at Delgado, Louisiana Transfer Degree programs had transfer rates with 23% & 24%, Teaching (Grades 1-5) had transfer rate of 18%, Performance & Media Arts had transfer rate of 25%.

It should be noted that not all programs are designed for transfer. Nor can we be sure that the students continued their same major at the transfer institution.

Report Limit:

This data is furnished to us by the National Student Clearinghouse(NSC). From the NSC report, sixty five percent of students were found and reported, the remained thirty five percent reported either no response, or were blocked by the school or student. NSC can not provide attendance and completion data for colleges that do not report these data to the Clearinghouse.
