

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#### 2015-16 Students Transfer to 4-yr Institutions as of April 2017

#### **Summary**

According to data received from the National Student Clearinghouse, 3,248 or 14.1% Delgado students that were enrolled in Academic Year 2015-16, transferred to another institution by Spring 2017.

Most transfer students transferred to UNO (22%), followed by LSU (12%), and then Southeastern (11%).

Of the transfers previous programs at Delgado, Louisiana Transfer Degree programs had transfer rates with 23% & 24%, Teaching (Grades 1-5) had transfer rate of 14%, Performance & Media Arts had transfer rate of 30%.

It should be noted that not all programs are designed for transfer. Nor can we be sure that the students continued their same major at the transfer institution.

#### Report Limita

This data is furnished to us by the National Student Clearinghouse(NSC). From the NSC report, sixty five percent of students were found and reported, the remained thirty five percent reported either no response, or were blocked by the school or student. NSC can not provide attendance and completion data for colleges that do not report these data to the Clearinghouse.
