

Transfer Report

2017-18 Students Transfer to 4-yr Institutions as of April 2019

Summary

According to data received from the National Student Clearinghouse, 3,119 Delgado students enrolled in Academic Year 2017-18, or 15.3%, transferred to another institution by Spring 2019.

Most transfer students transferred to UNO (21%), followed by LSU (15%), and then Southeastern (8%).

Of transferrers' programs at Delgado, Louisiana Transfer Degree programs had transfer rates of 24%, Business Administration had a transfer rate of 18%, and Accounting had a transfer rate of 16%.

It should be noted that not all programs are designed for transfer. Nor can we be sure that the students continued their same major at the transfer institution.

Report Limit:

This data is furnished to us by the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC). NSC cannot provide attendance and completion data for colleges that do not report these data to the Clearinghouse; nor do they report data for students or schools who block their response.
