The Lester E. Kabacoff School of Hotel, Restaurant and Tourism Administration of the University of New Orleans (UNO) College of Business Administration and the Culinary Arts and Hospitality Department of Delgado Community College (Delgado) Business and Technology Division have signed an agreement that establishes a 2+2 program. This 2+2 program allows students that complete the courses prescribed in Delgado's Hospitality Management Associate Degree to transfer to UNO to complete a Bachelor of Science Degree in Hotel, Restaurant and Tourism Administration (HRT).

Delgado 2 UNO Agreement

Program

Delgado Community College students with an associate degree in Hospitality Management will be admitted as HRT juniors in the College of Business Administration at the University of New Orleans provided they meet UNO's admission requirements. Course requirements for Delgado's associate degree in Hospitality Management are described on the next page of this document.

The total number of credit hours required to complete a bachelor's degree in HRT from UNO is 120 semester hours and students can transfer up to 51 semester hours for degree credit from Delgado to UNO. This is a 2+2 program in which Delgado students will earn a bachelor's degree in HRT from the University of New Orleans after successfully completing at least 69 additional semester hours at UNO and meeting all UNO HRT degree requirements.

Delgado students will follow the requirements in the *UNO Undergraduate/ Graduate Catalog* in force at the time they enter Delgado provided it is not over 10 years old and provided there was no break in enrollment of over 5 years.

In addition, in order to graduate from UNO, students must satisfy the following:

- Complete at least 50% of business courses at UNO
- Complete at least 15 hours of HRT courses at UNO
- Achieve a quality grade point ratio of 2.0 or better in:
 - all course work attempted
 - all course work taken at UNO
 - all business courses
 - all courses in HRT
 - all courses in HRT taken at UNO

Program Evaluation

UNO will evaluate on a regular basis the performance of HRT 2+2 students and other transfer students in upper level business courses and compare their performance to that of continuing UNO students. If the performance of the HRT-HOST 2+2 students needs improvement, faculty representatives from UNO and Delgado will meet to enhance the alignment of courses from the two programs.

Program Renewal

This agreement will be renewed every three years from the date of signing and will be continued, modified or terminated upon mutual agreement of the parties.






