





Accounting (ACCT)

I'd like to be able to get into my DCC email account. I would recommend the Accounting program at Delgado to people only wanting to receive their associates. Wanting to further your education was a hard transition I lost many credits and it's a lot harder and I don't think I was prepared for the stage of the UNO accounting program that I was transferred into.

Business Administration (BUAD)

It took 21 years but I was able to achieve a goal of earning a degree. This is due in large part to the flexibility and options offered by Delgado at a reasonable cost.

My experience at Delgado was a miserable one and I would never recommend anyone attend there. I enrolled as an online student when in my late 50s and already successful in the business world for many years. My goal was to complete an Associate degree in Business Administration and continue to a Bachelor's. Partially due to my incompetent advising at Delgado, continuation of my education is both feasibly and financially impossible. As an online student, my on-campus needs were few, however each visit was more frustrating than the previous one. In the Business Department, both my original adviser and his replacement were lacking customer service and communications skills, as well as correct knowledge to be advising students. My original adviser's incompetent advising" caused me to waste an entire semester of study and resulted in enormous anxiety when his" incompetence nearly cost me my ability to graduate at all. I was also told that the curriculum I was following would transfer in its entirety to UNO, which was not the case. (Delgado courses enumerated beginning with a "2" rather than a "3", even with identical course name, description and content, were not transferred.) This adviser's replacement was totally ill suited to the position. She was rude, uncommunicative and obviously did not know what she were doing. I truly feel that the work load for that the business division is far too great for any one person, and any failure to provide the appropriate guidance to a student, such as what I experienced, is a detriment to that student's success--which should be the primary objective of any educational entity and its reason for existing! My experiences with both Finance Aid and Registrar's offices were no better. Voice mails and emails were never answered. On site were unpleasant, personnel were rude, short tempered and generally treated me as if I were wasting their time. Interminable lines to request assistance, only to be sent to another location, only to be sent back to stand again in the same interminable line--how can this institution dare to claim it is educating anyone for the future when it is still operating with obsolete processes and procedures? I have lived in South Louisiana, in or near New Orleans, all my life and had often heard of Delgado Community College. Had I had any inkling that I would be so under served and ill treated as a student there I would never have begun that journey. In retrospect, no degree at all would have been preferable.

Business & Management (BUMG)

As a graduate of Delgado, I found my education was worth the time and effort I put into the program. I do wish that there were more courses in the Music Business concentration. I believe that this program could be more developed into an actual degree program.

The time I spent at Delgado was stressful. It was hard to schedule all of the classes that I needed to take at certain times of my student career. I was attending the Slidell campus and was quite limited. I was able to avoid attending the City Park campus. I am a 30+ year old father of three. Who works full time. This presented a challenge in itself. I gutted it out and graduated.

Draft & Design Technology (CADD)

I think the entire CADD department as a whole is really good. In comparison to other institutions and options it is far above. I think there are aspects that could definitely be improved on. Especially techniques and material. I felt like k-refs were not gone over enough and petty things that time should not have been spent on. If it is something that all instructors know company's don't use or do or vice versa then that's what you teach. Not 8 semesters on hidden lines. Although it seemed a lot more geared towards this recently. I was very happy to see that.

Computer Information Technology (CMIN)

For Web Design and Development majors, the curriculum needs to be changed and designed by a Web Designer instructor/professional. There were classes that I took that I didn't need to take for this major. A lot of the classes for this major were classes for Programmers. Hire instructors that can teach Content Management Systems (CMS) for the real world work force in Web Design and Development. 5 major classes that web design and development students need to know for the real world are #1 CMS's, PHP, MySQL and HTML, CSS. For example...WordPress, Drupal and Joomla.

Fire Science Technology (FPTC)

My time at Delgado has been met with very mixed results. The classes I took were informative and helped me learn more about my career as a firefighter. However, the enrollment process, meeting with my advisor, and dealing with many in the office staff (bursars and registrars) was a terrible experience. Many times I was sent back and forth between people, waited in very long lines and every time I talked to someone new they would just pass me along to another person in another office. This was wildly difficult for me and many times things couldn't be done over the phone so I had to go to the school in person forcing me to bring my kids (a 1yr old and 5month old). I am one class (an intro internet class) shy of receiving my associates degree in fire science (I did receive my Fire Science Certificate) and feel that I can't deal with the staff just to get into the class. I received a 4.0 GPA while attending Delgado and I have a Bachelors Degree from Loyola University of New Orleans; I want to finish my associates. However, dealing with registration and enrollment is so awful and the advising I received was so terrible I don't want to go back. The worst part of all of this is that I HAVE to go back to Delgado eventually to receive my associates for future promotions within the New Orleans Fire Department. Delgado has good programs, good professors/ instructors and a nice campus, but to get to all that good students are forced to jump through many hoops and climb around many obstacles just to get there.

Had so many advisers and different people that some were people friendly and others should not have been in that position.

General Studies (GSTD)

Address listed is my permanent address. I will have a new mailing address soon, as I am moving to Philadelphia in order to continue my education.

Attending Delgado Community College was a nice experience. There were some teachers that should not have been employed, but finishing the curriculum has prepared me for my future.

Delgado is a great community college. Thank you.

For every major an internship should be given; just by seeing that it is difficult to get a job in the workforce due to lack of work experience in a certain position.

I am blessed to have received a diploma in Associate of Science Degree.

I am currently continuing my education through Delgado. I just find it hard to communicate with staff on campus, it takes a few days to receive a returned call and sometimes not one at all. otherwise, an affordable college.

I attended Delgado for 4 years (due to being part time student and remedial courses) I never received advising. Thank god the website is great or I would have been lost. The administrative staff seriously needs attitude adjustment. Registering for classes or asking for any kind of help is a nightmare!

I believe there is room to improve more variety of night time classes at the Westbank Campus. There is not a whole lot of variety and I believe that is why enrollment is down at the campus. Also, this semester I am taking French One in the evening and I would like to take French two in the spring semester of 2015 but as far as I know it is not offered in the evening time. For normal working daytime people, there needs to be more classes like foreign language offered at night especially French.

I felt like the City Park campus looked down on West Bank campus. I've seen that on more than one occasion. Other than the stepchild complex it was an interesting experience.

I have not graduated yet. I am currently in my first semester at CSN. I do feel I am getting a great education and that I should not have any problem finding a job in my field upon graduation.

I was very pleased with all my instructors at DCC. They all strive to help me become successful in which motivated me to want to achieve more. The school's atmosphere was very warm and inviting. I always had a fear for math. However, I enjoyed using the math lab it help me to stop fearing math and just work out the problem. Thanks to great instructors.

I would like to attend Delgado in the future to get yet another degree. I felt the instructors there were the best I have had. I've attended SSLC in Lafayette, USL and UNO and feel Delgado had the better instructors, especially in Anatomy and Physiology.

The staff at Delgado that is put in place to help students are, to say the least, not helpful. They act as if they do not want to help you succeed and as if they could care less what we do with our lives as long as they get paid. It is a very stressful learning environment, and I know many people who stopped going to college simply because the schools employees are so rude. They honestly make you want to give up. (I am referring to those you are placed in the admissions/financial aid/advising positions. Those in place to guide confused students...all they do is further confuse and thus frustrate them to a point of giving up...West Bank and City Park campus) When I personally give people advise about Delgado I tell them "Just stick with it, they are going to make you want to give up, but just let the staffs rudeness and ignorance roll off your back so you can transfer to a more nurturing educational environment."

Hospitality Management (HOSM)

If I decide to go back and continue my education I would definitely look into returning to Delgado again.

It was hard to find a college in where I could continue my studies in Computer Networking, but I discovered that Herzing University is one of our sister schools and that made my transitional a lot easier, they took 56 of my credits and I am able to continue on to receive my Bachelors of Science within 1 year and a half.
