

### Fall 2011 - Spring 2012 Graduate Follow-up Survey Comments

#### Registered Nursing (NURS)

Basically Delgado & charity need to be more organized. Always something that delays you when trying to get an answer or something paid or what not. So unorganized. Mainly the staff at DCC. Especially financial aid.

Charity School for Nurses on scale 1-10, receives from me 10 plus. The best nursing instructors in the World, like Dr. Amy Bell, Ms. Nelly, Ms. Cavinton, Ms. Phillps and Ms. Barrow, Without them I would not make it. They are huge assets of Charity School of Nursing of New Orleans.

Delgado courses are not difficult enough to prepare a student for nursing school.

I am a recent graduate of Charity at DCC. I have not yet been able to find employment as an RN. It would be helpful if there was more assistance from the school in this area.

I am desperate to find a job. I have applied over and over again at every hospital in New Orleans and the surrounding area and have not received even 1 response. There are not enough jobs to go around for all the students pouring out of the nursing schools here. I'm starting to think that you have to know somebody. The student loan people are starting to ask for their money as my grace period has ended. I think that the nursing school should warn prospective nursing students that there is no longer a nursing shortage in New Orleans so that they may think twice before they begin. It's a tough program to go through and not be able to get a job after going through it is very discouraging. Thank You!

I believe that Charity as a whole has several flaws. There appears to be a lack of communication between each of the levels. There are some instructors who are great and seem to really care but as a whole not all of the instructors seem to be on the same page. It often appeared that the instructors were afraid to stand up for the students because of the backlash they may receive from other instructors in the program. The quality of test questions do not seem very appropriate. Having taken the NCLEX and passed I do not believe the things that were focused on by Charity were what I was tested on. I took the Hurst Review and used other NCLEX prep materials and found that information way more beneficial. The skills are not started early enough in clinical. Students should not be waiting until their final semester to learn to start an IV and risk the chance of ever getting to start one. The emphasis the first semester seems to be way to much on oral meds and bed baths than actual nursing skills i.e. foleys, iv meds, etc. The final semester "team" rotation is just another semester like NAC 1 with no real benefit of having a "charge" nurse. This program needs to be revamped completely with more communication between all of the levels, skills taught sooner and better written test questions.

### Fall 2011 - Spring 2012 Graduate Follow-up Survey Comments

I feel I have been well trained, but unfortunately everyone wants an RN with experience and a BSN! I would have preferred to go somewhere where you graduate with a BSN, but I know that no other school prepares RN's like Delgado Charity School of Nursing does. I will be returning to school for my BSN in Spring 2013.

I feel that the school could have done more for the nursing students to let them know about what really was ahead of them when looking for a job. A lot of my peers have yet to get an interview for a job as an RN and jobs are few and far between. I think that the teachers need to make it known to the students that getting a job as a tech and getting involved is important, but they often do not tell you until it is too late. As of this point I would not recommend anyone going to nursing school because they would be lucky to just get an interview, let alone a job!! I hope my fellow classmates that do not have a job will be able to become employed before the next class graduates.

I think the Delgado/Charity school of Nursing is a great program and I am proud to be a graduate from this institution, however, I wish I would have been told it would be necessary to continue my education to receive a BSN. If someone would have talked to me about this I could have prepared myself for the situation. I never thought I would have any difficulties obtaining a job as a RN but here I am eight months later and I still have no job. I have been told by nurse recruiters from local hospitals that I need a BSN so I have made my decision to return to school.

I wish the nursing program was a BSN degree because I am as prepared if not more so that other people who have graduated from BSN programs that I have made contact with at my new job. Additionally, I will need to return to Delgado in order to complete other prerequisites in order to obtain a BSN. This is disappointing to say the least.

Instructors in the pre-nursing classes are doing a fantastic job of preparing students for the nursing program. The nursing program at Delgado Charity School of Nursing has incredibly insightful, caring instructors. They have helped me become a more grounded individual and prepared me to be a fantastic nurse. I know that going to this school prepared me adequately for my chosen profession. I do wish there had been more guidance during my pre-nursing time to help me choose classes that I would later have been able to apply toward a bachelor's in nursing.

My last semester was one of a horrible experience and a wonderful experience. I think some of the staff need to be reevaluated. The first half of the semester I left clinical crying nearly everyday because of the treatment I received from my instructor. I also think the school could use a little work on the communication amongst staff due to disorganization.

### Fall 2011 - Spring 2012 Graduate Follow-up Survey Comments

PCN/MH semester was way too fast and condense. I believe that PCN needs it's own semester. The PCN staff was not helpful nor friendly.

Strength of experience at Delgado depended on instructor and institution chosen for clinicals. I do not feel clinicals were adequate to prepare me to do my job. For instance, per hospital student policy, in only 1/2 of one semester was I allowed to prepare my own medications (and that depended on the patient assigned). The last day of clinicals (graduating semester) was the only day I was assigned 2 patients. Due to patient census, most skills check-offs were earned by watching, not performing the skills. The learning lab did not have frequently-used devices/materials to practice with, and with rare exception, there was no supervision in the skills lab. Theoretical content was thorough and well-taught, for the most part.

The advising was great once I got in Charity School of Nursing. Before hand, when doing my prerequisites at Delgado, it was extremely difficult to get guidance. I think there needs to be more councilor at the campus. It was almost impossible to get an appointment. I would have to wait outside her office for days in a row to try and catch her because she would not answer her phone or emails.

The only advantage that I feel other nursing programs offer that Charity does not is a preceptorship during the final semester of senior year.
