





Registered Nursing (NURS)

The only suggestion I can make to the nursing clinical experience would be to train the students better time management skills. While at Charity I only cared for a maximum of two patients at one time (and it was only 1 time). The job I have requires me to care for six patients at once. I felt very unprepared when I started; and after 7 months I'm just getting the hang of it. I wish I would have had more experience caring for multiple patients, and the time-management/organizations skills that it requires.

Program prepared me for my Nursing career. More clinical experience, experience with charts (checking off orders), interaction with MDs doing rounds, and time management practice could be helpful for future nursing students.

I am a very determined person whom has been thought a lot, it is unreal with my medical issues that I completed this program. I completed the program and I am doing so well with management, decision making, communication and so forth....but it has NOTHING to do with Charity or their instructors. It is all my personal doing, past experiences, and shear determination of one whom has lived with a chronic physical condition and the will to survive, succeed and LIVE!!!

Charity was hard, but worth it.

Delgado Charity School of Nursing provided excellent education in my major. Although I am currently unemployed and have not yet worked under my major title I am proud to have acquire my education in this college. The market is tough at this moment and I don't blame my education, I believe when I am able to practice under my title I will be competent and prepared at what I do. The rest is up to me to further and better my future with continuing education.

Wonderful Instructors!

Very difficult to use an instructor as a reference 2 of the 3 that I would have liked to use are no longer employed at Charity School of Nursing. Mrs. Pittman, Mrs. Dixon and Mrs. Smith- Claggels not dissatisfied with the training but disheartened with the lack of available jobs. I guess even instructors "eat their young". That's a sad staff of affairs for students in faculty alike.

I didn't think the program was organized correctly. Nursing of the Adult Client I & Nursing of the Adult Client II should follow each other. I think the time that students spend on paper work should be spent in the hospital or skills lab getting hands on experience.

Charity was a wonderful school. In feedback from preceptors and managers, overall Charity puts out the most skilled students. I was taken out of orientation at 3 weeks, thanks to Charity School of Nursing.

I wish that DCC-CSN would have an additional study program for a BSN or provide a sister school to complete such education. In addition a referral or sister school for an MSN would be great.

Charity School of Nursing has a long standing tradition of providing good clinical skills with excellent theory based classroom instruction. It would benefit students to spend a summer clinical skills rotation at fee, since hospitals cut back budgets, nurse tech positions are difficult to obtain. Current theory is excellent. I felt the NCLEX was no harder than testing at Charity.

Because 6 months have passed and I am still unable to get a job in the nursing field, I plan to enroll in the RN to BSN program at LSU to continue my education.

I think the instructors I had made it extremely difficult and it was unnecessary. I currently work as a registered nurse and the whole care plan thing is so much easier than Charity makes it out to be. I spent hours and days trying to complete care planes and care maps and now with a click of a button I can complete an entire care plan in under a min. The pressure put on us to complete mounds of paper work is not helpful when trying to study for an exam. I just feel that the pressure Charity puts on its students is unnecessary and they should take that into consideration when viewing low test scores. Nursing school was the hardest thing I've ever done in my life!

Some of the instructors have to much control over something, I think other instructors should be asked to get involved when there is a dispute over work, for instant care maps and journals, every instructors have their own way of deciding if work is correct, it shouldn't be this way, it should be graded one way, and if there is a conflict other instructors should be allowed to look over it for an opinion.

There are "teachers" at Delgado nursing school who would eat their young, this is not a proper teaching method for the nursing profession or any profession for that matter.

My over all experience was great. It was hard, but I guess it should be or everyone could be a nurse. My instructors were awesome; always willing to help and explain things. I got a lot of experiences at my clinical locations.

The Financial Aid advisors suck.

Consistently heard from fellow students that clinical instructors were inconsistent with methods of instruction and grading -- need a clear set of expectations and goals, performance requirements, so that everyone is on the same page. Many dissatisfied comments from fellow students regarding this issue.

I'm not sure of any changes regarding the recording of classes for study purposes. The study habits the students use to pass the course should take priority in decisions to record lectures. The concern of attendance can be addressed by enforcing the policy set in place already. From personal experience, if it wasn't for Tegrity, I think it would have been a lot harder to achieve my honors status. Also, with the recordings, it was easier to tutor my fellow students who needed help.

My experience at Charity was very positive. The instructors were good; Celeste Phillips (NAC2) clinical instructor and Assistant Professor of the registered nursing program at Charity and by far, an EXCELLENT, encouraging, intuitive and "eager to teach," instructor. She guided you, but also allowed you some independence in the clinical setting.

I am extremely satisfied with my career as a registered nurse! While I was very intimidated when I started my first job after graduation on a med/surg floor, I knew I possessed the skills and knowledge to do my job well. I am now working in a plastic surgeon's office and absolutely love it. I am considering pursuing my master's degree and becoming a nurse practitioner.
