SACSCOC Statement of Criteria for Student Achievement

The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) requires that institutions publish "statements of goals for student achievement and the success of students in achieving those goals." Compliance with SACSCOC Principle 8.1, a SACSCOC Core Requirement, obligates institutions to publish goals and outcomes for student achievement appropriate to the institution's mission, the nature of the students the institution serves, and the kinds of programs offered.

The specific criteria for tracking student success Delgado Community College has selected are: graduation rates, retention rates, students transferring to four-year universities, credential completion, and pass rates on professional licensure and certification exams. Delgado measures outcomes on these student achievement criteria annually as part of its ongoing, integrated, institutional effectiveness process for evaluating how well it is achieving its strategic plan, mission, vision, and values. In addition, several of these measures align with targets set by the Louisiana Board of Regents as well as the "Louisiana 2020" initiative of the Louisiana Community and Technical College System (LCTCS).

1. Graduation Rate

Integrated Postsecondary Educational Data System (IPEDS) Graduation Rate for Students Who Graduate in 150% of Normal Time to Complete (Key Student Completion Indicator for SACSCOC)

Graduation rates are a standard measure that Delgado tracks and reports to federal and state governing entities each year. In general, assessing student graduation rates provides the College insight into how effectively it facilitates student completion in a timely manner. In particular, graduation rates for under-represented minorities are of special focus, as they are a student population considered to be at-risk among Delgado students (Ref. SACSCOC *Resource Manual*, Notes to CR 8.1).

In 2017 and 2018, SACSCOC charged member institutions to select, from four available measures of graduation rates, the "Key Student Completion Indicator," the one that best represented the institution's mission, the type of students served, and the nature of the programs offered. The IPEDS Graduation Rate was selected by the College because this rate is the most widely recognized graduate rate for postsecondary institutions, and because it provides a point of reference for comparing Delgado's outcomes to those among peer, state, and national public two-year colleges. The graduation rates shown in Table 1 measure the first-time, full-time, degree- and credential-seeking students who complete in 150% of normal time. For example, an associate degree program is normally two years in length, so 150% of normal time is three years.

2. Retention

2.1 Fall-to-Spring Retention

The Fall-to-Spring retention of first-time, full-time, degree- and credential-seeking students is a standard metric that Delgado tracks and reports to state governing entities each year. At Delgado, these cohorts consist of students who are attending college for the first-time, are enrolled for at least 12 semester hours, and are enrolled in a credit-earning program leading to a credential recognized by the Board of Regents.

The Fall-to-Spring retention rate is calculated based on the number of these students who enroll each fall and who are still enrolled in the subsequent spring.

2.2 Fall-to Fall Retention

Fall-to-Fall (first-to-second year) retention is a standard metric that Delgado tracks and reports to federal and state governing entities each year. At Delgado, these cohorts consist of students who are attending college for the first-time, are enrolled for at least 12 semester hours, and are enrolled in an associate-degree program recognized by the Board of Regents. The Fall-to-Fall retention rate is calculated based on the number of first-time, full-time, associate degree-seeking students who enroll each fall and re-enroll in the subsequent fall.

3. Students Transferring to Four-Year Universities

Many associate degree programs at Delgado are transfer-ready for students who seek admittance to a four-year college or university. Delgado has transfer articulation agreements with numerous four-year universities in Louisiana and with some in other states. The annual number of transfer students provides a measure of the College's effectiveness in preparing students to enter a four-year university.

According to the LCTCS definition for this measure, a student is counted as transferring to a four-year institution if they are enrolled at Delgado in a given academic year (July 1 – June 30), and enrolled at a four-year university in the following academic year, according to National Student Clearinghouse data for student enrollment.

4. Students Earning a Credential

4.1 Total Unduplicated Completer Count

The number of students (total unduplicated count) earning a credential recognized by the Board of Regents is a standard metric that the College tracks and reports to federal and state governing entities each year. This metric aligns with under multiple components of the College's 2017-21 Strategic Plan, including Goal I-A ("Create a culture of completion") and Objective I-A-5 ("Identify and address barriers to student completion") and with Goal 1 of LCTCS' "Louisiana 2020" initiative. Completions overall and completions by adult and under-represented minority students are Key Performance Indicators in the Board of Regents Strategic Plan. Adult students and under-represented minorities also comprise student populations considered to be at-risk among Delgado students (Ref. SACSCOC *Resource Manual*, Notes to CR 8.1).

4.2 Adult Student Completers

The number of adult student completers (age 25 and older at start of graduation year) who complete a credential recognized by the Board of Regents is a key performance indicator selected for Delgado in the Board of Regents Strategic Plan, and is aligned with the 2019 Board of Regents' Master Plan which calls for 60% of all working adults (ages 25-64) in Louisiana to hold a degree or high-value credential by 2030. Adult learners are a core constituency of the College, comprising approximately one-third of the student body, with the Fall 2020 semester student population showing an average age of 28.1 years.

4.3 Under-Represented Minority Completers

The number of under-represented minority students earning a credential recognized by the Board of Regents is a key performance indicator selected for Delgado in the Board of Regents Strategic Plan. Under-represented minority students are defined by Board of Regents as those with a race of: Black, Non-Hispanic; Hispanic; Native American or Alaskan Native; and Hawaiian or Pacific Islander. Under-represented minority students complete at lower rates than non-minority students, although they comprise a major portion of Delgado's student body (58% of Fall 2020 semester students were under-represented minorities).

5. Pass Rates on Professional Licensure/Certification Exams

Delgado offers many degree and credential programs that aim to produce workforce-ready graduates in vocational fields. The College tracks passage rates of students on professional licensure and certification exams in programs whose fields require or prefer a certification or licensure for employment. Pass rates on licensure and certification exams provide the College objective insight into how well such programs train students in the knowledge, standards, and competencies required for entry into their fields. Professional licensure of graduates in their respective fields aligns with the College's 2017-21 Strategic Plan, particularly Goal II-A ("Develop the Emerging Workforce") and Objective I-B.2 ("Enhance programs to ensure employability of graduates"). In addition, continued programmatic accreditation for some programs requires that Delgado students achieve a minimum average pass rate on the exam. Table 5 lists each such exam next to the Delgado program of study that prepares students for the exam.
