## Delgado EMERGENCY PLAN for Train Derailment

- Notify Emergency Services: In case of a train derailment near the College, the first step is
  to immediately call emergency services, including 911, to report the incident and provide the
  exact location of the derailment.
- Activate Emergency Alert System: Notify the Safety and Risk Manager who will promptly
  activate Delgado's emergency alert system, which may include text messages, emails, social

- Coordinate with Emergency Services: The Command Center will interface with
  emergency responders, medical personnel, firefighters, police, and hazardous materials
  teams, to ensure coordinated response efforts. This may involve providing access to college
  facilities, resources, and personnel, as well as sharing information and updates on the
  situation.
- **Monitor the Situation:** The Command Center will continuously monitor the situation and stay updated on the progress of the train derailment response efforts. This includes keeping the College community informed through regular updates via the emergency alert system and other communication channels.
- Follow Cleanup and Recovery Procedures: Once the train derailment has been controlled, the College will follow appropriate cleanup and recovery procedures in coordination with railroad authorities, environmental agencies, and other relevant parties. This may involve assessing and repairing any damage to the College's infrastructure, coordinating with cleanup crews, and ensuring the safety of the campus before resuming normal operations.
- **Conduct After-Action Review:** After the train derailment response is complete, the College will conduct an after-action review to assess the effectiveness of the response efforts, identify any areas for improvement, and update the emergency plans and procedures accordingly.
