Memorandum of Agreement between Loyola University New Orleans and Delgado Community College

- 1. This agreement has been developed in the firm belief that it provides a valuable educational opportunity for students using the existing resources of Loyola University New Orleans (Loyola) and Delgado Community College (Delgado).
- 2. This agreement establishes a continuing cooperative program of two (2) years undergraduate study at Delgado Community College (Delgado) and two (2) years at Loyola University New Orleans (Loyola) wherein students may earn a Bachelor of Applied Science degree (BAS) from Loyola.
- 3. Admitted students will typically attend Delgado for two (2) years and Loyola for two (2) years.
- 4. Students entering this program must be academically acceptable to Delgado and Loyola at the time that they enter the respective institutions. Each institution maintains full autonomy on deciding qualifications for admission.
- 5. Delgado students will hold an Associate of Arts, Associate of Applied Science, Associate of General Studies, or Associate of Science degree at the time they enter Loyola.
- 6. After successfully completing the first two years of the prescribed curriculum at Delgado, the student will apply with a recommendation from Delgado to Loyola's Admission Office for admission to the BAS degree from Loyola.
- 7. Delgado graduates seeking to transfer to Loyola University must request an official transcript from Delgado's Registrar's Office. Loyola's Office of Admissions will ensure that applicants meet admissions requirements at Loyola. Upon transferring to Loyola, admitted students will be guided and advised by Loyola's Online City College.
- 8. Satisfactory preparation in coursework at both institutions is defined as follows:
- (a) A grade of C or better in each course taken at Delgado.
- (b) An overall cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or better earned at Delgado for acceptance fulltime to Loyola.
- 9. Successful completion of the coursework at Loyola means that the students have achieved a GPA of at least 2.0 in the student's program, and have achieved a cumulative GPA of at least a 2.0.

- 10. A minimum of sixty (60) credit hours of coursework at Loyola is required for the BAS degree. Transferred Delgado students are also subject to other residency and graduation requirements at Loyola as stated in the University Bulletin.
- 11. After successful completion of the coursework at Loyola, students will receive a Bachelor of Applied Science degree from Loyola.
- 12. This agreement will be administered by the appropriate Associate Deans/Administrators in each of the institutions.
- 13. This agreement will come into force when signed by the designated officials from both institutions and will remain in effect for five (5) years. Both institutions may at any time review this agreement and the actions taken under it. Modifications to this agreement may be made only in writing by mutual consent. This agreement may be extended upon its expiry with the written agreement of both institutions.
- 14. Delgado students, in their final semester, may have the Loyola experience by attending Loyola as a visiting student and register for CITY-A196, Online Adult Learning (3 credits) with a 50% tuition discount. This tuition will be billed directly to the student and the credit would apply towards the Bachelor of Applied Science degree should the student decide to continue at Delgado.
- 15. According to FERPA guidelines, , Delgado will send Loyola a report each fall semester of associate degree recipients from the previous year, , including name and contact information, for marketing purposes.
- 16. Either Loyola or Delgado may terminate this agreement by appropriate written notice of at least 180 days by either party.
- 17. A Transfer Articulation Roadmap is listed in Appendix A.
