Summary



- ◆ Our enrollment continues to increase, but at a lower rate than in the fall. It increased 7% over Spring 2003.
- ◆ African American enrollment increased by 11%, White enrollment by 7%.
- ◆ African American students are the largest ethnic group at Delgado making up 43% of the students attending Delgado.
- ◆ 56% of our students are minorities.
- ◆ Male enrollment increased by only 5% where female enrollment increased by 8%.
- ◆ The percentage of male students continues to decline.
- ◆ The Northshore Site had the largest increase at 35%. Charity School of Nursing follows with 31%. West Bank Campus had an 11% increase. City Park increased by 2%.
- ◆ First-time Freshmen increased 12%, transfer students decreased by 9%.
- ◆ Nursing majors (including pre-nursing) increased by 15%. Radiologic Technology increased by 17%. Pharmacy Technology increased by 16%.
- ◆ Plaquemines Parish enrollment increased 21%.

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


Enrollment by Campus & Parish

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


This has resulted in a large decline in enrollment in the Community & Workforce Development and an increase in the Technology Division.


Enrollment by Admission Status & Classification
