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CREDIT FOR PRIOR LEARNING (NON-TRADITIONAL CREDIT)

Delgado Community College may award college credit for knowledge gained through private study and/or work experience. These credits are typically referred to as <u>prior learning (non-traditional) credits</u> and also include the award of credit for non-credit coursework.

The types of prior learning (non-traditional) credit available at Delgado are <u>Advanced Placement</u>, <u>College Board Advanced Placement Credit</u>, <u>College Level Examination Program (CLEP)</u>, <u>Credit Examinations</u>, <u>Life Experience Assessment Program (LEAP)</u>, <u>DSST (DANTES Subject Standardized Tests)</u>, <u>Industry-Based Certification Credit</u>, <u>Military Credits</u>, <u>Technical College Credit</u>, <u>Correspondence Credits</u>, <u>Credit for Non-Credit Coursework (through LEAP and/or Credit Examinations)</u>, and <u>Prior Learning (Non-Traditional)</u> Credits from Other Institutions.

Specific policies and procedures have been established for the granting of college credit for prior learning (from non-traditional sources):

- A student must be enrolled in a degree-seeking program beyond the official Census day of enrollment in order to request prior learning (non-traditional) credit. Credits may be requested only for <u>courses that are offered by Delgado</u>.
- Dual enrollment students are eligible to seek Prior Learning Credits in Advanced Placement, CLEP, Industry-Based Certifications, and College Board Advanced Placement Credit.
- 3. The prior learning (non-traditional) credit granting process must be requested and completed by the midterm of the semester in which it has been requested.
- 4. Only three (3) prior learning (non-traditional) credit hours may be earned **after the student enrolls** for any of the final 12 hours of credit toward a degree or certificate.
- 5. Semester hours of credit earned through prior learning (non-traditional sources) are assigned a grade of "P." No quality points are earned, and such credit is not added into the student's grade point average. Prior learning (non-traditional) credits are identified on the student's transcript as credit granted through prior learning (non-traditional sources).
- 6. A maximum of 24 semester credit hours may be awarded from prior learning (non-traditional sources).
- 7. Prior learning (non-traditional) credit cannot be awarded in a course that a student has previously completed or enrolled in at any college (excluding coursework completed before Academic Amnesty is declared for which the student earned a grade of "C" or higher).

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8. No more than one-third of credits needed in Required Major Courses (those courses which require a minimum grade of "C") may be obtained from prior learning (non-traditional sources).

9. Students who plan to use credit from prior learning (non-traditional sources) to meet the degree requirements of other institutions should check the requirements of the receiving institution, as this type of credit is often re-evaluated by the receiving institution.
